Suggestions for English Syllabus - Form III.

Composition. Free, imaginative writing arising from children's own interests. Short stories from a given choice of titles. Writing in dramatic form - Letter writing of various kinds. Verse making. Oral work, giving speeches on a chosen topic to the form & so on.

Punctuation. Lessons given as the need arises from free work and also definite exercises to learn & improve skills. Children should be expected to use a comma correctly in lists, for joining parts of a sentence, in speech & for addresses.
