Form Lower IV 10-11 years

The Tudor period and the Reformation:-

Reformation in England. Study of the struggles between Catholics and Protestants. Stories of reformers and victims of persecution.

Form Upper IVB 11-12 years

Stuart period:-

Form Upper IVA 12-13 years

Intensive revision of whole syllabus.
