11-12 years

Grammar: 5 declensions of nouns. (Regular and irregular)
All declensions of adjectives.
Comparisons of adjectives and adverbs.
Pronouns.
6 tenses, indicative mood active and passive of verbs
regular and irregular. Imperatives.
If adequate progress has been made the subjunctive
mood may be learnt during the summer term.
Rules of time and place. Use of pronouns.
All numerals.
Constant weekly revision of all grammar from Kennedy.

Translation, exercises and reading from Approach to
Latin Book I.

Form Upper IVA
12-13 years

Grammar: Revision of all declensions of nouns and adjectives.
Verbs, all tenses active and passive voice, indicative
and subjunctive mood of regular and irregular verbs.
Deponent verbs. Lists of principal parts to be
carefully learnt. Pronouns. Personal relative,
emphatic, reflexive, possessive, interrogative,
demonstrative, indefinite.
Constant and intensive revision of all grammar.

Exercises: Use of subjunctive, final and consecutive clauses.
Participles. Some children will be ready for
indirect statement, command and question, and the
more advanced rules of syntax.
