SATURDAYS

The same as other days until after Assembly at 9.30. Then one set of senior children prepare the Sunday Service (about thirty minutes' work for a group of fifteen children). Some seniors may have work to do from 9.30-10.30. From then on, till bed-time stories, the day is free for play, for expeditions, visits to concerts, museums, etc., and often on a Saturday evening the children produce their own plays, or they may have a film show.

SUNDAYS

Breakfast is at 9 a.m. School Sunday Service is held in the hall from 10.30 to 11.0. From then until after tea there is time free for play, reading, expeditions and walks. After tea there are Sunday stories or special Sunday employments.

VISITING

Children may go out with parents or friends on Saturday between 11.15 a.m. and 5.30 or 6.30 according to age and on Sundays between 11 a.m. and 5.30 or 6 p.m. Boarders may, if their parents desire, go home fortnightly at week-ends. A list of these week-ends is sent out at the begining of term and parents are asked as far as possible to keep to them so that there may be a real feeling of community life during the intervening week-ends.
