

Rules for Stories.

1. Do not tell the story too quickly.
2. Be careful of the detail that it is suitable for the children.
3. Open the boxes before the story is begun if the building and the story are to be in the same lesson.
4. Do not give too much in one lesson.
5. Develop one building from another, but do not let all the buildings be pure imitation; let some be original.
6. Let all the children have an aim in their buildings. Let children try first alone & then when they have built something let them examine & criticise.
7. The teacher must be interested in the story if she wishes to inspire her children with interest.
8. In dictating buildings, when giving the distance between one cube & another be careful not to use a cubic measure as a linear.
